

**INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY CERTIFICATE GUIDELINES**

A student must satisfactorily complete at least 21 units of Intellectual Property related courses as specified below to earn an Intellectual Property Certificate. Course substitutions are permitted by the Faculty Director for good cause.

**Basic IP Courses**

A student must satisfactorily complete three of the following courses:

- Trademarks and Unfair Competition (655A) (2 units)

A student must satisfactorily complete two of the following courses:
